MCOG Meets in Willits October 5

Mendocino Council of Governments (MCOG) will hold its next regular meeting on Monday, October 5 at 1:30 p.m. Usually held in Ukiah, MCOG will meet “on location” at City Council Chambers, 111 East Commercial Street in Willits. All MCOG meetings are open to the public.

The Council will hear a presentation on transportation plans and projects in the Willits area, including bicycle, pedestrian, streetscape, safety and pavement improvements, federal stimulus projects, Willits Bypass interchange locations, and future Brooktrails second access road connections.

At 11:00 a.m., MCOG council members will take a tour of project sites on a bus provided by Mendocino Transit Authority. Members of the public may ride along on a space-available basis. The bus will arrive at City Hall at 10:45 a.m.

Acting as the Regional Transportation Planning Agency, MCOG programs or allocates various types of state and federal transportation funds to County of Mendocino and the four incorporated Cities of Ukiah, Fort Bragg, Willits, and Point Arena, and to Caltrans as a project partner. Much of the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act programs available for transportation projects in Mendocino County flow through MCOG. In addition to supporting projects within its five member jurisdictions, MCOG helps support transportation activities of the Mendocino Transit Authority, North Coast Railroad Authority, local airports, and on state highways, among others.

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
