The Mendocino Council of Governments (MCOG) is beginning the update process for the 2026 Regional Transportation & Active Transportation Plan (RTP/ATP). The last plan was adopted by MCOG on February 7, 2022, and updates are required every four years. The 2026 plan (due February 2026) will identify needs and projects for the next 20 years in all modes of transportation including bicycle, pedestrian, streets and roads, highway, and transit.

The 2022 RTP/ATP contains a Tribal Transportation Element to address Tribal transportation needs (*see attached*). We ask that you please review this information, paying careful attention to the section specific to your tribe. Information regarding existing transportation facilities, transportation needs, population, housing, etc. is based on information found in plans and documents and input received from the tribes during the last update. In some cases, the information may be outdated and no longer accurate. Please provide us with updated information on your tribe's transportation needs, as well as any future plans that may increase transportation demands.

We would be happy to receive any additional information you would like to provide regarding transportation in Mendocino County, and how it impacts the Tribal community. We are also interested in receiving any recent transportation plans that have been prepared for the Tribe.

MCOG staff is planning to report on the 2026 RTP/ATP update at the bi-annual Caltrans Tribal Transportation meeting on October 30, and this would be a good opportunity to learn more about the RTP/ATP update. We would also be happy to provide direct consultation to your Tribal Council, if desired. Our monthly Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meetings (agendas posted at www.mendocinocog.org) provide an ongoing opportunity for Tribal input, with the inclusion of a standing agenda item for Native American input.

TRIBAL TRANSPORTATION in RTP

Primary forms of transportation serving the tribes in Mendocino County:

Roadways that serve the tribes can be:

Tribal Transportation

Objectives

TT 1. Implement activities in a knowledgeable, sensitive manner respectful of tribal sovereignty.

Policies

TT 1.1 Consult with and involve the tribes in the development of planning documents. Routinely, this applies to development of the Regional Transportation Plan and the biennial State Transportation Improvement Program

TT 1.2 Provide the tribes with information regarding various Federal, State, and local transportation grant programs for which they may qualify.

TT 1.3 Routinely transmit MCOG's policy and program recommendations, actions, and information having potential effects on the tribes' land or resources to the tribes.

Tribal Transportation

Goal: For Tribal residents within Mendocino County to have safe, effective, functional transportation systems, including streets, roads, pedestrian and bicycle facilities and transit.

Objectives

TT 2. Establish and maintain government-to-government relationships with the tribes in order to establish clear and open, ongoing communication between MCOG and the tribes

TT 3. Provide a transportation network that safely and sufficiently provides access between tribal lands and their surrounding communities

Policies

TT2.1 Meet with the tribes to review the status of the government-to-government relationships and exchange information, as appropriate.

TT 3.1 Coordinate with tribes to consider financial partnership on projects that serve tribal lands.

TT 3.2 Coordinate with tribes and surrounding communities to identify safety concerns on the transportation network serving their areas.

Tribal Transportation

Goal: For Tribal residents within Mendocino County to have safe, effective, functional transportation systems, including streets, roads, pedestrian and bicycle facilities and transit.

Objectives

TT 4. Provide opportunities for Tribes to have early input on regional transportation issues.

Policies

TT 4.1 Include a standing agenda item on MCOG's Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) monthly agendas to receive tribal input on transportation issues.
